
Page 3 of this issue contains a short treatise on how Helen and Frankie formulated and acted on the idea of a club newsletter.

Little known facts about Matt, W3CCX, from the "Johnsville Reflector",

"MATTHEW CRIARDI, SCIENTIST, DIES"

Electronics Scientist Natiber Galardia an employee of the Control and Guidance Division: AREL, died unexpectedly Tuesday: February 4th. He was 53 years old.

A native of Poston, Massachusette, Mr. Gelardi first some to the Philadelphia area in September 1942, while on active Mavy Duty. After a year at the Maval Aircraft Factory and 25 years at NAMC, he was transferred to the Maval Aircraft Madification Unit, Johnsville as Leading Chief (Radar/Radio) in July, 1944.

He remained in this capacity until his discharge in early 1947. He liked the area so well that he returned shortly after his discharge in a civilian capacity, accepting a tempory appointment as a laboratory Mechanic on Jan. 20 1947.

Some six months later Mr. Gelardi was given a probationary appointment as an Electronics Engineer in the Electronics Sections Pilotless Aircraft Divisions On February 4, 1948 he shifted from the Pilotless Aircraft Development Lab. to AKKL, where he has been since with the exception of the period from October 5, 1950 to March 30, 1952, when he was recalled to active duty.

Refore being called to active duty in May, 1941, Mr. Gelardi was suployed for 72 years as a Radio and Sound Raginson; and 84 years prior to that as a test empireor, all in the Boston area.

He was a member of the Institute of Radio Engineers and the American Radio Relay Lasgue. Mr. Golardi is survived by his wife, Carver, of 2606 Horshas Road, Hatboro, Pennsylvania.

We of Mt. Airy V.H.F. Radio Club, will miss pleasant, quiet spokes Matt, and extend our sympethy to his family.
