

Dear Dave,

The attached information concerning the forthcoming 144 MHZ, translantic tests by EI2VUI (GRID SQUARE I0-53) was obtained from the West Kent Amateur Radio Society during a recent business trip I made to the UK. Please assist me in giving it the widest possible dissemination to interested VHF amateurs along the US East Coast. Unfortunately, I obtained the information too late to appear in the August edition of QST magazine, so direct mailing and depending on each of you to spread the word in the only way to get the information out. If you have access to local amateur media with a publication date prior to the scheduled test, do not hesitate to reproduce the attached information as provided. In addition, may I encourage you to disseminate the information on established VHF and UHF nets such as the Pack Rats or the East Coast 70 cm net.

In addition to the information provided in the attached, the West Kent Amateur Radio Society will have equipment to listen on 50.080 MHZ and 220.080 MHZ to facilitate possible crossband operation either to HF or 144MHZ. I recently delivered a 220 MHZ converter provided by Bill Seabreeze, W3IY/4 and a low noise 220 MHZ preamplifier. The operation on 50 MHZ and 220 MHZ will be receive only due to television and military usage of these frequencies in the Republic of Eire.

The presence of double hop "E" propagation during the tests would allow this first-ever transatlantic terrestrial QSO. The distances are roughly similiar to establishing contact with Arizona and New Mexico on 144 MHZ from Eastern Pennsylvania, a feat that has already been accomplished; further, the great circle path between Eire and the US East Coast is actually more north to south than it is east to west.

Please send a QSL card to the West Kent Amateur Radio Society, C/O Mr. Nigel Peacock, G4KIU, 64 Cleveland, Tunbridge Wells, Kent, England, TN2 3NH with the information solicited on their information sheet. Also, have others that you contact do the same to facilitate determination of beam hearings. Nigel's phone in the UK is (44) 892 33586. Also send me a QSL with the same info for hand delivery.

If I can provide any further information, please call me at (301) 535-3590 in the evening. I hope to make at least one more trip to the UK before the scheduled tests and would be glad to deliver any messages or relate any of your desires to the Society. Of special interest to the West Kent Society would be a listing of 50, 144, and 220 MHZ beacons in existance, their frequencies and identifier. I have already provided this data for the Johns Hopkins AFL 144MHZ and Woodbridge Wireless 220 MHZ beacons in the Washington DC area. Please provide any information you have on other VHF beacons with your QSL's.

YORK ROAD RADIO CLUB NIGHT

In late May, Ron Cohen, K3ZKO called me on the land line to inform me he had a color film, taken in 1938-39, on the activities of the York Road Radio Club. The film belongs to Bob Sutter, W3SOB. The YRRC was founded in the early 1930's and drifted away in the 1960's. Harry Stein, W3CL and myself stopped in to see Ron to preview the film. We also took slides, supplied by Fred Hoffman, K3DEY, of the activities of the YRRC in 1958-60. We found them to be excellent and they should be shown to other interested hams. We required a place large enough to show them so I volunteered the Warminster Amateur Radio Club meeting room on our monthly meeting July 3. This date would also be OK for Bob, W3SOB as he would be up here that week from Florida.

K3ZKO, W3CL, K3DEY and myself, aided by an available YRRC roster of the 1950's, plus on the air contacts through the Pack Rats, Delmont, Phil-Mont and WARC Clubs invited anyone interested to attend the July 3 showing. The response was tremendous: 8 Pack Rats, 3 Delmont, 1 PARA, 1 Phil-Mont and 12 visitors with no club affiliation showed up. Total attendance was 83 of which 18 were identified as ex YRRC members.

All attendees were encouraged to "chime in" whenever they could identify anyone or for any humorous incidents. The audience participation was terrific. Both the slides and the film covered banquets, picnics, field days and individual ham stations. Field days haven't changed much except for larger and more bulky equipment, lack of beam antennas and old cars. Shots of individual stations showed mostly 6' relay racks which probably consisted of one, or a pair of, 210's with perhaps less than 100 watts input and virtually everything was home brew.

Everyone seemed to enjoy the evening -- great get-to-gether for us old timers and I think the younger generation who probably never saw us old guys, with home brew rigs and our funny looking clothes enjoyed it also. We will have to do it again sometime.

We wish Ed Braddock, WIXV, a speedy recovery from recent surgery.


