NEW PRODUCTS OF INTEREST TO HAMS By Lynn, W3NSI

<u>1. Genave GTX 600</u>: This new ten channel FM 50-54 Mc transmitter/receiver is rated for 10/40 watts output. Receiver sensitivity is .25 UV for 20 DB quieting. Separate channel switches for receive and transmit allow 100 channel combinations. Genave GTX 100. The 220 Mc version is rated at 12 watts output and .35 UV for 20 DB quieting. Both units should be available as this is published.

2. Ham M Antenna Rotor (Cornell-Dubilier): A new version of the popular Ham M is now available. This unit has an all new control box, using push buttons for CW and CCW rotation. Power can be switched on without rotating the antenna, so that direction can be monitored at any time. The rotor head uses stainless steel gears.

3. VHF Prescaler: K-Enterprises PD 301 will extend the range of a normal 30 Mc counter to 300 Mc. Unit is complete with built-in power supply and pre-amp. In use, it is connected to the counter input and signals entering the prescaler are divided by 10 and fed to the counter. A signal at 146.94 would then read 14.694 on the counter read-out. 

It was reassuring to have <u>compliments</u> from the Field Operations Bureau that amateurs are most cooperative in cases of complaints of interference to others. In a recent year FCC had 42,000 complaints of interference; 38,000 of these were "home entertainment" equipment, of which 34,000 were manufacturing deficiencies in the receiving or hi-fi gear. Of the remaining four thousand, <u>3,600</u> were from <u>CB</u>, and only 400 were from Amateur Transmitters.
